



Sports premium funding – Impact report 2016 - 2017

Background

The school received £9,774 (April 2016 – March 2017), from the Department for Education to improve the quality of P.E and Sport for all children at Broom Valley Community School.

The impact of the Primary PE and Sport funding must highlight an increase in the participation, standards, attainment and progress of all pupils. Additionally, it should encourage pupils to develop healthy lifestyles and support children in reaching the performance levels that they are capable of.

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles.
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

Review

Events entered: Football, Rugby, Hockey, Athletics and the School' Sports Day.

Clubs delivered: Change 4 life, Multi-skills, Athletics, Gymnastics, Football.

Staff CPD: REAL PE INSET planned for the Autumn term. Real Gym to be introduced to staff.

Special events: Walking Bus, Bikeability, Sports Day, P.E lessons linked to the Olympics topic.

Awards: We came 1st within the Family of Schools Rugby competition. We also came 2nd in the Hockey and Athletics competitions.

		Quality of teaching	Staff rated their confidence in teaching PE out of 10 (1 – no confidence, 10 – extremely confident) at the beginning of the year and at the end of the year. 75% staff reported that they felt more confident and children were more engaged and focussed within lessons. We hope to follow this up next year with Monitoring and Assessment as well as extra training for teachers where needed.
